# **New Theology Curriculum Task Force**

Earlier this summer, pastors, teachers, and representatives from NPH, MLC, and the Lutheran Schools team met at the Center for Mission and Ministry. These individuals have joined together, forming the WELS Theology Curriculum Task Force representing early childhood through high school instruction. The task force has begun a two-year process in developing a vision of God's Word instruction in our schools and creating learning standards. The work of this task force is the first phase of development for the new theology curriculum. New Lutheran Schools team member Melanie Giddings will coordinator the task force efforts in her part-time role while also continuing her current call serving Fox Valley Lutheran Schools.

## **WELS Testing Update**

WELS Testing Partner NWEA was purchased by Houghton Mifflin Harcourt in January. As NWEA neared that merger, WELS was informed that NWEA intended to renegotiate the at-will partnership with WELS. After some negotiation they offered that the minimum fee would continue to be waived, if the Lutheran Schools office served as the billing department for all WELS NWEA testing schools. Due to the merger, the logistics to inact this change were not in place. The 2023-2024 school year will be the last year of the old WELS/NWEA contract. Expect your NWEA rep to present new prices and new terms when the 2024-2025 contract time arrives.

Due to all this uncertainty and some concern over some of the messaging NWEA has sent out, WELS explored marketplace options for testing. Fox Valley Lutheran Schools began using iReady, a testing product from Curriculum Associates. We have begun the process of seeking a preferred partner status with them. While the number of students that Fox Valley Lutheran Schools tests is large, the number of students needed to justify a contracted relationship needs to grow. ## **Teacher Call Window**

The window for calling active teachers from the field begins on **October 15, 2023**, and runs through **April 15, 2024**. The volume of teacher calls remains high and congregations are encouraged to plan ahead, keeping the following in mind:

- Teacher call list requests are submitted electronically at wels.net/callrequest.
- Request forms must be complete and submitted at least 14 days prior to the requested call meeting.
   Calling bodies should use the two weeks to prepare all items for the call packet electronically, so that the call and accompanying documents may be e-mailed to the candidate called within 12 hours of the meeting.
- Remember to include compensation information using the compensation calculator: **cwcompcalc.wels.net**.

# **WELS School Accreditation (WELSSA)**

What's new in the world of accreditation? WELS School Accreditation (WELSSA), a tool for schools to evaluate their ministry based on Scripture and sound educational principles, continues to grow, with 46% growth of the program over the past decade. One of the many benefits of becoming an accredited school is an appreciation of the many blessings our gracious God has already provided. WELSSA also identifies new ways in which a school ministry can better serve its students and surrounding community. Schools and early childhood ministries learn WELS School Accreditation to understand their strengths and areas for improvement by working through a self-study of the WELSSA standards.

This fall, the Commission on Lutheran Schools will likely approve three schools for first-time accreditation, bringing our accredited total to 156. These early childhood ministries, elementary schools, and high schools are located in fourteen states serving over 21,000 students. WELSSA continues to grow as there are fifteen new schools that will be seeking first-time accreditation during the next two school years.

During 2022 - 23, the work of several different early childhood taskforces came to fruition as our WELSSA standards are seeking recognition with YoungStar, the quality rating and improvement system for early childhood programs in the state of Wisconsin. If approved, all WELSSA accredited early childhood ministries would be recognized with YoungStar. WELSSA remains an active member with the National Council for Private School Accreditation (NCPSA), providing us and the schools we serve with national oversight. In the vein of continuous improvement, upcoming WELSSA projects include revising our elementary school standards, studying the mandatory standards at the high school level, and revising the WELSSA consultant role.

Each year over 100 knowledgeable volunteers from WELS schools serve WELSSA as consultants, captains, and team members. We could not do this important work without our volunteers! - 1. Go to **cloud.wels.net/me**. Read the "Important Information", then proceed to My WELS Cloud and login. (The username will always end with "@wels.net".)
- 2. Click on the **School Information** link in the "Unit" section to review and update. Information icons are available on the form for assistance with specific fields.
- 3. Early Childhood Ministry and Elementary Schools have separate "units." Early Childhood staff will be listed in the Early Childhood unit.
- 4. Please contact Lutheran Schools if you believe your faculty listing is incorrect.

## **Teacher Self-Assessments**

**Teacher Self-Assessments** are important for calling bodies and worker self-development and should be updated **annually**.

Duties, Subjects, and Grades tabs in the **Teacher Self-Assessment** should be completed as applicable. The "Top 5 Strengths" section on the Strengths & Goals tab is for use with an optional online **CliftonStrengths Assessment**. If you are interested in completing this section, visit **store.gallup.com** to purchase and then share your top 5 strengths in your Self-Assessment. If you have not taken the **CliftonStrengths Assessment**, please leave this section blank.

We ask all Called workers to indicate their ministry goals and interests in the "Ministry goals and Interests" comments box on the *Strengths and Goals* tab.

## **Self-Assessment Reviews**

The Conference of Presidents requests that all **Teacher Self-Assessments** go through a review process. Teachers are to have a School Leader review their Self-Assessment. Principals/ECM Directors, please take the time to carefully review the forms and offer suggestions for changes as you see fit. Principals and directors are asked to have their Self-Assessments reviewed by the school board chairman or pastor of the congregation. Please note that Self-Assessments are different from the Summative Teacher Evaluation in which School Leaders review classroom instruction and management, etc. **Teacher Self-Assessments** inform us about your ministry preferences, abilities, and experience.

After a teacher has completed the Self-Assessment form, he/she is asked to undertake the following steps as outlined in the Finalize & Submit tab:

- 1. Follow the instructions on the Finalize & Submit tab to have your Self-Assessment reviewed.
- 2. Meet with your reviewer to discuss the form and modify rankings if needed.
- 3. Use the Comment Field to indicate any areas in which you and your reviewer may disagree.
- 4. Complete the reviewer information fields and submit your Self-Assessment.

Please note that the "Submit" button will not be enabled until the reviewer's name, title, and date of review are entered. Once the "Submit" button has been clicked, your Self-Assessment will flow directly into your WELS Cloud account and will be available for viewing in **Personal Biography** under Reports.

## **Lutheran Schools Annual Support**

#### Kids c.a.r.e

The kids c.a.r.e. (care about reaching everyone with the gospel) program is designed to teach children about



mission outreach. The Lutheran Women's Missionary Society's kids c.a.r.e. project for 2023-24 is "Missionary Kids Retreats."

Missionary children, especially ages 14-25 years old, have been raised overseas in other cultures and find there are extra struggles to assimilate when returning to American culture. Funds raised will help defray some of the expenses for this unique group of our WELS Christians when they attend the annual weekend retreats. At the retreats, these young adult missionary kids receive tools to cope with these many changes and forge friendships with other missionary kids who have shared similar experiences.

Free materials are available at **lwms.org/kidscare** including: instruction letter, poster, offering box template, parent trifold brochure, and a poster coloring sheet. There are three levels of lesson plans: PreK-Grade 1 (non-readers), lower-level (Grades 2-5) and upper-level (Grades 6-8). Each level has two lesson plans, designed to be integrated with the Christ Light curriculum, and will contain age-appropriate enrichment activities, such as music, crafts, recipes, and activity sheets.
